Growing on to Finish

Media:	Professional potting media
pH:	5.5-5.8
Irrigation:	Keep plants moderately moist but not wet
Fertilizer:	Light-moderate feeders- Feed during the cool growing season when plants are active.
	Apply 50-75 ppm N at each watering. Monitor EC levels in soil to avoid root burning from elevated salts. Avoid feeding during the summer as plants are inactive.
Light:	Provide 50% shade to prevent stress from sunlight
Temperature:	Growing: 50-55F days/ 40-45F nights
Pest & Disease:	Scale can be a problem.
	Crow rot, root rot, botrytis
Vernalization:	Cold temperatures required for active growth. Force at 45-55 degrees for best flower performance.

Grower Tips:

- Can be sold the same season as a green plant. Expect only 10-15% will flower the following spring. Helleborus must be mature to achieve consistent flowering. After the first season expect 10-15% to flower. After the second season more consistent flowering will appear.
- Helleborus prefers cool temperatures and shaded conditions. They put on most of their growth in early spring and then again in fall. Summer potting is not recommended.
- Push pots together tightly during the summer to keep roots cool.
- Reflective aluminum shade cloth works well to keep the crop cool in the summer.
- Avoid overfeeding and overwatering in the summer months when plants are inactive.

To Overwinter:

Helleborus grow under cool conditions.

- Overwinter in a coldframe with white poly.
- Be sure to vent as needed so as to avoid an early warming period.
- Bait for rodents.
- Avoid overly wet conditions from condensation.
- As temperatures rise above 35° F begin to space the crop.
