When to plant	Summer-early fall; late winter-spring

Growing on to Finish

Media:	Professional well-drained potting media – requires excellent drainage
pH:	Prefers neutral to alkaline conditions (pH 6.8 and above)
Irrigation:	Allow media to dry slightly between waterings. After planting plugs, grow slightly dry until new growth appears. Once actively growing then lavender prefer to be slightly moist. Avoid over-watering to ensure a healthy root system and avoid watering late in the day to prevent foliar diseases.
Fertilizer:	Likes low fertility - feed recommendation is 100-ppm nitrogen, low phosphorus, plenty of calcium.
Light:	Needs high light for best performance.
	Once plant receives vernalization treatment, will flower regardless of daylength.
Temperature:	Rooting out: 68-74F
	Growing: 60-70F days with nights 10F cooler
	Holding: 50F
Pest & Disease:	Insect problems are rare. May get aphids.
	Damping-off, leaf spot (Septoria), root rot (Armillaria) and Botrytis
Vernalization:	Needs vernalization for flower induction. Needs 8-10 weeks of cold treatment (~41F).
	Trim plants after cold treatment for best look.
Pinching:	Soft pinch 2 weeks after planting can be helpful

Grower Tips:

- Lavender prefers cooler temperatures when they begin to root out (~65F)
- Retailers should display lavender in high light areas and maintain cool temperatures
- Avoid plant growth regulators if plant is to be consumed
- Wet, poorly-draining soil and high humidity conditions with poor air movement are the demise of lavender plants and often will lead to decline.
- Best growing practices is to pot in summer, bulk, let them go dormant, and sell for next year
